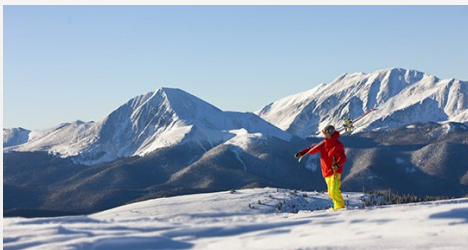

The abstract must be written in English and should have the following structure:

Title

Author(s)

Affiliation(s), City, State, Country

Keywords

Introduction

Methods

Results

Discussion

Conclusion

References

Acknowledgement

Abstracts are limited to 1 page (either 8.5"x11" or A4). Minimum font size is 10 pt.

### **Abstract Review Process:**

Each abstract will be reviewed by at least two members of the scientific committee. Abstract will be categorized as follows:

**Accept:** Abstract is accepted with only minor editing required at the discretion of the editor of the book of abstracts.

**Accept with minor changes:** Abstract is accepted after the authors respond to the reviewers' concerns to the satisfaction of the chair of the scientific committee

**Reject and resubmit:** Abstract is rejected unless the authors can make satisfactory responses to the reviewers' concerns.

### **Abstract Submission:**

- 1) Prepare the abstract following the guidelines
- 2) Fill out the abstract submission form online at the Congress website
- 3) Upload your abstract by choosing your filename in the dialog window (browse the files on your disk and choose the file you want to submit) that appears when you click on the 'Browse' button.
- 4) A successful abstract submission email will be sent.

## Lodging Information

The Congress will be held at the Keystone Lodge and Spa at Keystone Resort, Colorado. We have organized several lodging options, including rooms at the Lodge itself, and with other nearby options. For Conference Village lodging, it is a short walk of less than 5 minutes to the Congress meeting. A free shuttle bus will be available. River Run and the Inn at Keystone are located a few miles away and would require either a brief automobile or free shuttle ride. Free parking is available across Route 6 from the Lodge. Shuttle timing will be organized to coordinate with the Congress sessions and activities, but generally is about every 20 mins. During early May 2011, Keystone Resort will be closed for skiing and riding. Nearby Arapahoe Basin will be open for skiing and riding (see activities page). The above rates are based on standard occupancy per bedroom. If a reservation is made within 30 days of arrival, full payment is due at such time. After a deposit is received, a confirmation will be sent. Keystone will offer transportation packages to attendees making individual reservations. Individual cancellations within 30 days of arrival are subject to forfeiture of full deposit amount. Individual cancellations outside of 30 days of arrival will result in a refund of the deposit less a \$30.00 processing fee. Keystone is accessible via:

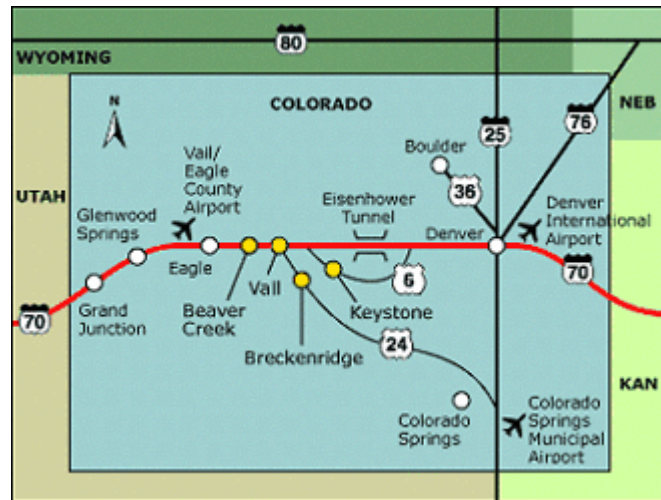
### Denver International Airport (DEN)

Located just outside of Denver, the airport is 90 miles east of Keystone via Interstate 70. DIA is a nonstop destination for over 21 national and international carriers.

**Vail/Eagle County Airport (EGE)** is 65 miles west of Keystone.

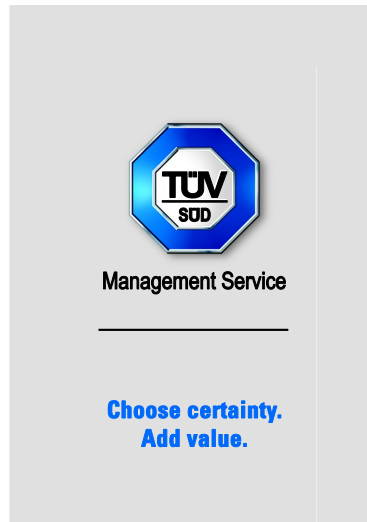

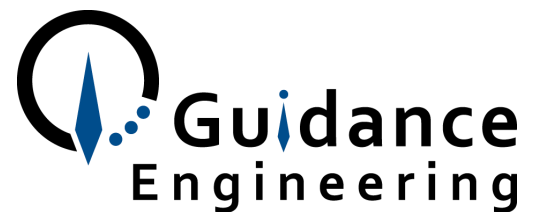
